Session-I- Basic Veterinary Sciences

A mock session was arranged before the commencement of the actual presentation to familiarise the new platform for the presenters. A total of 33 participants, comprising 23 faculty members and 10 students presented their research work. Participants from 10 different states were actively involved and presented in an effective manner without much internet disturbances.

Almost all the participants had their online presentation for the first time and they felt convenient and comfortable. The session had uniform distribution from different disciplines presenters categorised under the Basic Veterinary Sciences. The abstracts and power points were prepared well and presented in an accessible manner. The paper presentation competition was evaluated in two categories: faculty and others as first and students as second category.

Knowledge was gained on digitalisation in teaching Veterinary Anatomy replacing the conventional method of inhumane sacrifice of animals. The presenter highlighted the advantages of the technique as cost effective, eco-friendly and permanently durable.

Usage of IFN-Lambda-3 as immunomodulator to boost the host immune response against Foot and mouth disease virus, by *in-vivo* and *in-vitro* was well elaborated.

With the help of recent and advanced methods, several unexplored urinary antimicrobial peptides could be characterised, and could be employed as an alternative to antibiotics to overcome the antimicrobial resistance among animals and humans.

Identification of ecto and endo parasites among wild animals and characteristic structural details of human ticks using scanning electron microscopy were also discussed. Chief Guest Dr. R. V. Prasad,


Presentation on selection of oocyte and embryo quality a key to successful animal reproduction and impact of environmental adversities on animal reproduction evoked discussion.

Session IV- Clinical Sciences II

The chief guest of the session, Dr. Chandrasekhara Rao, Dean, Thirupathi Veterinary College, addressed the importance of one health and the need for ensuring minimal environmental contamination by animal waste and animal associated products, including veterinary drugs. He also insisted that the need of the hour is for the veterinarians to associate with conservationists and conservation biologists to ensure one health. A total of 54 papers were selected for presentation. Among these, three were full-length research papers and others were abstracts.

Out of the eleven papers selected from faculty, six were presented. The presentations on review of treatment modalities in treating transmissible venereal tumor, management of vaginal fold prolapse in dogs and management of heat stroke in a dog were very informative.

Among 43 papers selected from students, 30 were presented in the session. Majority of the papers were discussed individual cases rather than population studies.

Moist dressing for a contaminated and necrotic bite wound in a dog using combination of magnesium sulphate, sulphacetamide and urea along with zinc oxide along with systemic oral antibiotic and serratiopeptidase resulted in a speedy improvement of the condition and regeneration of skin tissue by 10 days of treatment.

Study on fungal pathogens isolated from uterine and vaginal mucosa from cows and buffaloes suffering from uterine infections revealed 40 fungal isolates, of which 30 belonged to *Aspergillus* spp. especially *A. flavus*.






